Individualised studies for international mobility students

With over 3,000 students, Bern University of Teacher Education (PHBern) is one of Switzerland's major universities of teacher education.

Bern University of Teacher Education trains teachers for the entire school system: pre-primary, primary, lower secondary, upper secondary, as well as special needs. Every year, 700 qualified teachers graduate from Bern University of Teacher Education with a degree in teaching.

Training at this university is characterised by a large amount of practical work, which is facilitated by the university's cooperation with more than 70 schools offering internships. This ensures that students are well prepared for their future professional life.

Training takes place in the modern vonRoll university centre, a former industrial compound. Bern University of Teacher Education shares these attractive premises with the University of Bern. The largest library in the city of Bern, the vonRoll library, can be found here.

Bern University of Teacher Education supports teachers not only during their studies, but throughout their entire career – with advanced training courses, conferences and courses in advanced studies. The university's media centre offers practising teachers a large selection of teaching and learning media for all subjects. The core tasks of Bern University of Teacher Education also include research, development and evaluation. The aim is to link research, teaching and school practice.



Individualised studies for international mobility students

Bern University of Teacher Education offers incoming mobility students with proficient knowledge of English the following selection of individually arranged modules. After having applied for a mobility semester at Bern University of Teacher Education, incoming students create their individual study programme with the help of their assigned counsellor.

The selected modules for incoming students take place in an authentic setting within the standard curriculum for domestic students. Within the modules incoming students are given specific individual support by the teaching staff. Mobility students can produce all their contributions in English.

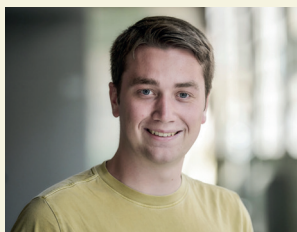
